Dr. Aggrey AGUMYA – Director for Research and Innovation, Forum for Agricultural Research in Africa (FARA)



Aggrey Agumya is the Director for Research and Innovation-designate for the Forum for Agricultural Research in Africa (FARA) since I September 2020. He joined FARA in in 2006 as the Programme Officer for the Sub-Saharan African Africa Challenge Programme. In 2008 he was appointed to serve as the Technical Advisor to the Executive Director, before being appointed in 2016 as the Director in charge of Stakeholder Engagement and Communications.

Aggrey Agumya actively takes part to the consultation with all stakeholders in food systems as part of the drafting of the continental manifesto on forgotten and underutilized foods which will be presented at the UN Food Systems Summit later in 2021. During the second quarter of 2021 FARA coordinated consultations championed by GFAR that led to the elaboration of a manifesto on forgotten foods in Africa. Aggrey Agumya considers that Africa has vast potential to feed its population, among others by making use of forgotten foods as they are nutrient dense, resilient and well-adapted to the local growing conditions.

Dr. Lawrence HADDAD – Executive Director, Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN)



Lawrence Haddad is GAIN's Executive Director since 2016. He also chairs Action Track I of the UN Food Systems Summit to ensure access to safe and nutritious food for all since 2020, and is the co-convener of the Standing Together for Nutrition. Prior to GAIN, Lawrence Haddad was the founding co-chair and lead author of the Global Nutrition Report from 2014 to 2016, the Director of the Institute of Development Studies (IDS) from 2004 to 2014, and the Director of

the Food Consumption and Nutrition Division at the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) from 1994 to 2004.

From 2009 to 2010, Lawrence Haddad was the UK representative on the Steering Committee of the High Level Panel of Experts (HLPE) of the UN Committee on World Food Security (CSF). From 2010 to 2012, he was the President of the UK and Ireland's Development Studies Association. As an economist, Lawrence completed his PhD in Food Research at Stanford University in 1988.

Lawrence Haddad and David Nabarro were awarded the 2018 World Food Prize for their engagement in bringing maternal and child nutrition to the forefront of the global food security agenda.

Jolenta Joseph is a young nutritionist, food entrepreneur and agrifood processing trainer in Tanzania. She has made remarkable progress in the country's fight against hunger through innovative uses of local crops both with her company Sanavita which adds value to crops such as orange fleshed sweet potatoes (OFSP), beans and maize; as well as a nutritionist at the SOKOINE University Graduate Entrepreneurs Cooperative (SUGECO). She was part of the SUGECO

team of the Building Nutritious Food Baskets (BNFB) project (2016 - 2018) led by the International Potato Centre (CIP) which focused mainly on how to use OFSP purée to make different bakery products and achieved excellent results, for example reducing production costs by 45%.

Jolenta has won two international awards, the 2020 Sun Pitch Competition Food Technology Innovation Prize given by the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN), and the mentorship prize granted by AGREA, a social enterprise working on sustainable farming and based in the Philippines. She also won the 2018 "Malkia wa Nguvu" prize in the Agribusiness category which awards visionary women who inspire and build opportunities for their families and communities.
