She started her career with the European Commission and has also worked with various ACP embassies and NGOs in areas related to food security, rural development and trade. Before joining COLEAD, she was the Manager of the Technical Centre for Agricultural and Rural

Cooperation ACP-EU (CTA) Brussels Office (2004-2020) implementing policy initiatives related to the ACP-EU cooperation in the field of agricultural and rural development. She has led agribusiness projects in support of capacity development of SMEs, entrepreneurs and farmers organisations across Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific.







CHICHI ERIOBU - CEO, PHRONESIS FOOD, NIGERIA

Chichi Eriobu is the Founder and CEO of Phronesis Foods Nigeria Limited, a food processing,



packaging and export company, creating new food product lines from existing raw materials. Her vision is to build a globally recognised solution-based business and to impact other young entrepreneurs.

Chichi's consistency with growing her company with very minimal funding has gained both her personal and business brand a global recognition. In 2020, Phronesis Foods Nigeria Limited was recognised as one of the top 6 businesses to get into Entrepreneurship World Cup (Nigeria) and in 2021 the company was selected top 14 agri-businesses across Africa by GoGettaz Africa.

A multiple award-winning entrepreneur, Chichi was awarded Best Female Business Speaker of the Year (Leadership Mind Awards, 2017) and Outstanding Entrepreneur of the Year Award (BAOBAB International Awards, 2018). In 2020, she was appointed to the Board of Crown Point College of Health Sciences and Technology, Ogun State, Nigeria. The same year, she emerged first runner-up from season 7 of the entrepreneurial reality TV show named *The Next Titan*. In 2021 she won an award for influence through Business & Entrepreneurship, presented to her by FBI Awards.

Chichi also mentors hundred entrepreneurs on business and entrepreneurship and teaches other small businesses on how to leverage grant funding for their business growth, hence her first eBook is titled *How to Pitch Your Business*.
