




Successes: (i) Development of a training module, (ii) Negotiation of a joint programme "Agroecological transition in West Africa".

Creation of the "Alliance for Agroecology in West Africa (3AO)".


ROPPA is a founding member of 3 AO
ROPPA beuses the secretariat of 3 AO

- ROPPA houses the secretariat of 3 AO
 3 AO includes 74 regional and international
 - networks and structures (producer organisations, civil society organisations, research institutions, etc.).

Successes: (i) Institutionalisation of a regional agroecology forum

(ii) Development of a contribution note (1st edition of the regional forum about AO) to support the development of a regional AO strategy (ECOWAS)

Dialogue with IFAD for the implementation of the IGREENFIN project. At the heart of the process with its national platforms (CPF, CNOP Mali, CNCR, ANOPACI, FONG, PFPN)



3. Operational success

- 3.1 Strengthen the training offered by producer organisations to ensure a critical mass of change agents
 - Development of 14 pooled training modules and 8 video capsules and 1 trainer's manual (ROPPA), 1 guide (CTOP) and 2 image boxes (CPF and CNOPM) on good agroecological practice,
