






Be a **for-profit legal entity** registered and with operations in one of the participating OECS member countries: **Antigua & Barbuda, Commonwealth of Dominica, Grenada, Saint Lucia, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Vincent & the Grenadines.**



At least 1 year of operations as of the application date.



A minimum average annual turnover of USD 6,000 during your last year of operation.

Must contribute KPIs to resilient low carbon development

Eligibility Criteria - Interest-free Loans USD 30,000 - USD 50,000



Be a **for-profit legal entity** registered and with operations in one of the participating OECS member countries: **Antigua & Barbuda, Commonwealth of Dominica, Grenada, Saint Lucia, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Vincent & the Grenadines.**



At least 2 year of operations as of the application date.



A minimum average annual turnover of USD 30,000 during your last year of operation.

Assessment Criteria & Selection

| CRITERIA | DESCRIPTION | WEIGHT |

| Paradigm Shift Potential | The degree to which the applicants can achieve sustainable development impact beyond a one-off investment through replicability, scalability and knowledge transfer potential. | 20% |
| Green Economic Recovery and Co-Benefits | The degree to which the Accelerator applicants' entities can lead to green jobs created and supported as a result of the project in the next 5 years, also including green economic recovery and improvements. | 20% |
| GHG Mitigation, Adaptation Potential and Waste management commitment | Mitigation: Emission mitigation potential measures in TonCO2 avoided over the project's life and cost per Ton of CO2 avoided Adaptation: Adaptation strategies to reduce the negative impact of Climate Change, including tangible actions. | 20% |
| Alignment with National and regional targets and needs | Alignment with national or regional resilient low carbon development targets. | 20% |
| Financial viability | Financial viability, risk mitigation strategy and likelihood of financial close demonstrated by appropriate investment metrics | 20% |
