Discrimination against women on the basis of sex and gender, linked to factors such as:


-Race -Ethnicity -Health -Age

## WHAT ARE THE ROLES OF RURAL WOMEN IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN TODAY?

#### Agri-food systems

- Set of activities, landscapes and actors, private and public, linked to the production, transformation, distribution, trade, consumption and discarding of food.
- They include agricultural, industrial and service activities that complement and depend on each other.

Present in all stages, sectors and activities of agri-food systems.


Seed protection, plant cultivation, food production, animal management

They are part of ensuring food and nutrition security in the Americas.





### WHAT IS THE SITUATION OF RURAL WOMEN IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN?



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Latin America and the Caribbean have 58 million rural women, 17 million are registered as economically active and only 4.5 million are considered agricultural producers.

Women in rural areas have the worst rates of employment and access to basic services, and are predominate in informal, low-quality and lower-paying jobs.



If rural women producers had the same access to productive and financial resources as rural men, their crop yields would increase by 20-30%.



If women produced under the same conditions as rural men, there would be a 12-17% reduction in hunger. Globally, women account for 43% of the agricultural labour force.



In the case of young women, they work more hours in total, but fewer paid hours, so they often have no income of their own, which makes them more **economically** dependent on their father, brothers or partner; which in many cases leads to situations of abuse and control, and other expressions of violence.





## HOW HAS COVID-19 AFFECTED RURAL WOMEN IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN?

In the rural areas of the Region, before the pandemic, there were an estimated 40.9 million workers and 22.6 million women workers.

During the period of confinement, 38% of women lost the possibility to go out to work compared to 20% of men.

(Gutiérrez, Martin and Ñopo, 2020).

Extreme poverty in rural areas could reach 42 per cent, an unprecedented figure. There would be 10 million rural inhabitants – almost 6 million of them women – who would enter a situation where income is not even sufficient to cover basic food needs.

(FAO, 2020a).










## ANNEX 2: WHAT IS THE SITUATION OF RURAL WOMEN IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN?



#### Access to credit → limited data

Low coverage of women farmers, with a variation between 4% and 13% of women with access to credit, according to records from Peru, Ecuador, Nicaragua, Brazil and Chile.

What makes it difficult for women to access credit is the fact that their main productive activities are for self-consumption and do not generate direct monetary income.

(Nobre et al., 2017).
