Jeremy is an accredited coach for leadership and professional development. He has been appointed as General Delegate of COLEAD in June 2019.



Professor Rohanie Maharaj – Food Science and Technology programme, University of West Indies

Professor Rohanie Maharaj is currently the Programme Coordinator of the postgraduate programme in Food Science and Technology at the Chemical Engineering department, and is actively involved in teaching, research, outreach and administration in the Food Science and Technology unit at the University of West Indies (UWI), St. Augustine Campus, Trinidad and Tobago.

Professor Maharaj was awarded a grant by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nation to conduct a series of capacity building webinars and discussion workshops on Food Packaging Practices in the CARICOM region in December 2020. Prior to this she was involved in a FAO project on Agro-processing for Small Entrepreneurs in Belize. She has coordinated several short-courses and workshops on fermented beverages, food microbiology, sensory evaluation and food packaging for industry and public audiences. She also received a grant from the Campus Research and Publication Fund Committee in 2022 on Rapid Testing of Contaminants.

Apart from her twenty-seven (27) years of academic experiences, Professor Maharaj brings fourteen (14) years of significant industry experiences, where she has worked at Johnson & Johnson in the manufacturing and marketing sectors leading quality and reliability at a senior level. She is well trained in building quality at the international level and has also served in the capacities of Team Chair and Evaluator for external accreditations on behalf of the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago (ACTT).

John Robin - Owner, Benjo's Seamoss & Agro Processing Co Ltd, Dominica

John Robin is the funder and owner of Benjo's Seamoss which has become – over the last 25 years- the largest sea moss production company in the region. The company produces so-called "meal in a bottle" health beverages that include 8 energizing flavours: Original, Peanut, Oats, Linseed, Pure, Boisbande, Ginseng and Ginger. The drinks are exported to around 20 Caribbean countries, as well as to the USA. John Robin was studying fisheries development in Canada when he realised the potential value of sea moss. Sea moss (also referred to as Irish sea moss or red algae) is a versatile superfood which contains 83% of all essential nutrients and is high in antioxidants as well as vitamins A, D, E and K. After returning to Dominica, John conducted research to bottle sea moss and extend its shelf life.

Aside from his processing activities, John works on advancing the cultivation of sea moss within local communities in Dominica. He is involved in training and assisting individuals who want to grow and harvest seaweed which he might then be able to process. He is also Chairman of the Dominica Manufacturers Association (DMA).



Negus Sealy - Brand Manager, International Food Science Center, Barbados

Negus Sealy is currently the Branding and Marketing Manager at the International Food Science Centre, an initiative of Export Barbados that aims to provide a quality food processing facility for micro processors that currently produce in non-commercial conditions. Negus attained a Bsc. with Hons. In Economics and Management from the University of the West Indies Cave Hill in Barbados and progressed to add value across a wide cross-section of various sectors in Barbados inclusive of production, tourism, construction, agriculture and food and food safety.

Mr. Sealy is equipped with extensive experience in sales , product analysis and development and is especially competent with regards to the management of all processes encompassing the transformation of raw materials into final products that are market ready and saleable.

His current professional goal is to incrementally increase the economic output of Barbados through the awareness and utilization of the International Food Science Center and moreover to enable a shift in the narrative and culture of dependency on and consumerism of imported products by facilitating a framework for a new outlook on industry and production in Barbados.

Ms. Webbe is Co-Founder and Managing Director of BWC, a coconut-based company that has been in existence since 2016 and has been paving the way in innovation by producing all natural coconut products and its derivatives. By manufacturing all natural

products, the company has been able to provide an income for women and families throughout the community.

Strongly believing in zero waste, Tricia has has been awarded Community Champion for the environment. She is also a part of the Alliance for Coconuts team organised by the International Trade Center (ITC) and the United Nations. Being a part of the Alliance for Coconuts network has enabled Tricia to gain deep knowledge about agriculture of the coconut plants and reviving the coconut industry in the Caribbean, using new innovations such as tissue culture of the coconut palm. She strongly believes that reviving the coconut industry in

the Caribbean will play an integral part in the lives of women and families throughout.
