- Regional Integration ECOWAP PAU
- Crises: food, security, geopolitics, nutrition
- Climate change
- Demographic growth
- Innovations involvement of young people & women in food systems

INTRA-REGIONAL TRADE DYNAMICS IN WEST AFRICA (1/3)

- ECOWAS UEMOA trade policies: CET
- Trade in roots and tubers, dried cereals, rice, fish products, live cattle, vegetable oils and market garden produce (onions, potatoes).
- More and more processed products: fruit juices, flour, meat, etc.
- Market size: USD 10 billion

INTRA-REGIONAL TRADE DYNAMICS IN WEST AFRICA (1/3)

- Dynamic market: 54 million urban consumers in 1990 - 435 in 2050
- 70% non-cocoa and coffee exports between countries in West Africa
- Women = 70% of jobs in food systems & 90% in food processing (OECD)
- In 2020, more than **USD 60.5 billion** in food imports, and USD **13.2** billion in intra-African trade (UNCTAD).

Some cross-border markets

- Mali Mauritania Corridor
- Mali-Senegal corridor Burkina-Niger corridor
- Gulf of Benin corridor (Benin, Togo, Niger, Nigeria, Ghana) - Niger-Chad corridor

Some ASPHF products: (processed and unprocessed) dried cereals, rice, fruit and vegetables (local vegetables), livestock, poultry; oilseeds; non-timber forest products; re-exported agricultural products....

OPPORTUNITIES - DYNAMICS - LEVERS OF CROSS-BORDER TRADE (3/3)

- Complementary production areas
- Cross-border areas: increased demand for food products - supplying towns and cities
- Dynamics of positive factors favourable to the transformation of production and marketing structures: support for young people's and women's entrepreneurship; ICT - networking between young people and women - financing mechanisms (MFI -BC dynamics)
- Cross-border markets: infrastructure governance...

ROLES - IMPACT OF CROSS-BORDER TRADE (3/3)

- Essential for the economic activities, food security and livelihoods of local people in cross-border areas
 particularly women and young people;
- Essential for supplying towns and determining eating habits
- Cross-border trade affects economic activities and eating habits in towns (e.g. local products);
- Conflict and risk management in cross-border areas

CHALLENGES - OBSTACLES

- ECOWAS trade and tax policies
- APE OMC ZELEAF
- Access for women and young people to productive resources
- Business capacity and competitiveness
- Energy/inputs land

RECOMMENDATIONS (1/2)

- In-depth integration: ECOWAS Free Trade Area -FTAA - trade and tax policies
- Strengthening support for women and young people: better coordination of initiatives; accelerating the agri-food transformation supported by this group; making the most of ICTs and innovations;
- Rethinking EU-AU agricultural cooperation
- Improving access to energy and land
- Taking better account of climate change and agroecology

RECOMMENDATIONS(2/2)

- Promote local/regional purchasing programmes source of food aid to create markets for farmers
- Enhancing and supporting the role of local authorities in promoting cross-border trade
- Developing greater coherence between trade and agricultural policies;
- Strengthen market information mechanisms, insurance mechanisms and access to finance
- Strengthening cross-border markets
