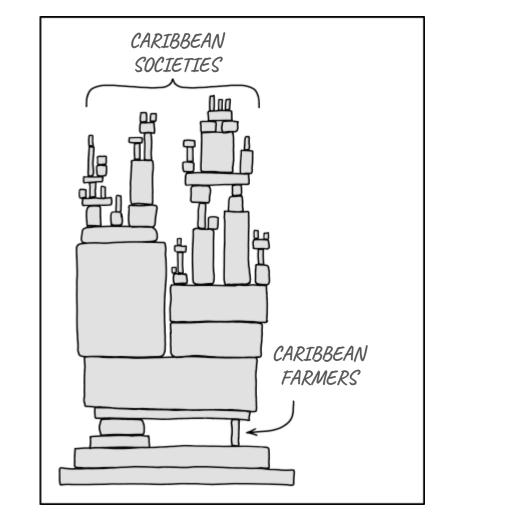

Regional Realities

Trinidad

- Exemplary data and farm monitoring infrastructure
- Business primarily driven by intermediaries and centralised at government-supported wholesale markets
- Dependent on imports for some core commodities
- Some import relationships more sustainable than others
- Low manufacture cost

Dominica

- Exceptional potential for growth capacity
- Agriculture is culturally engrained
- Government engaged as a consolidator through DEXIA
- High climate risk
- Aging farmer population

Saint Vincent

- Lowest cost of production
- About 60% of produce exported to Trinidad and Tobago
- Roots+tubers market controlled mostly by a handful of Trinidadian intermediaries
- Significant source of Trinidad and Tobago's eddoes, ginger, dasheen, tannia

Shared problems

- 1. Unideal data
- 2. Dependency on high-cost imports
- 3. Limited industry engagement

- 2. Meet users where they are
- 3. Get dirty, start running

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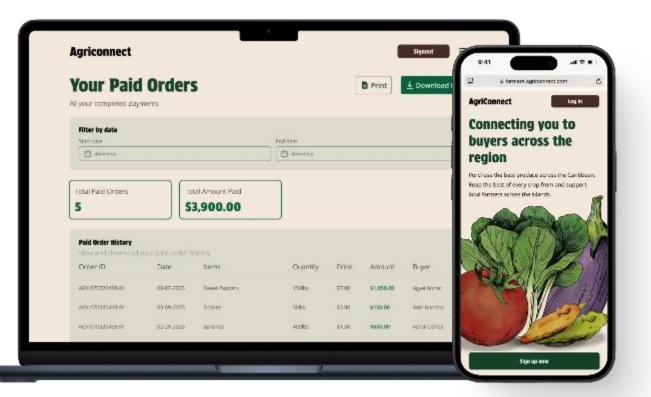




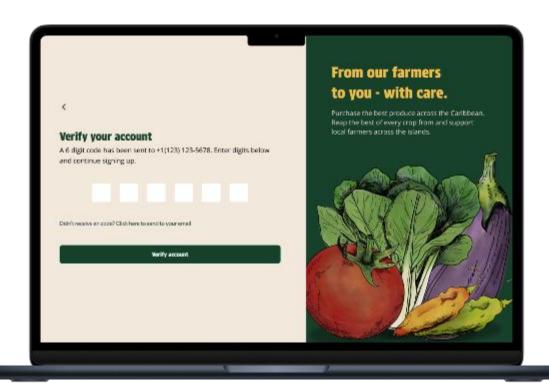

Buyers

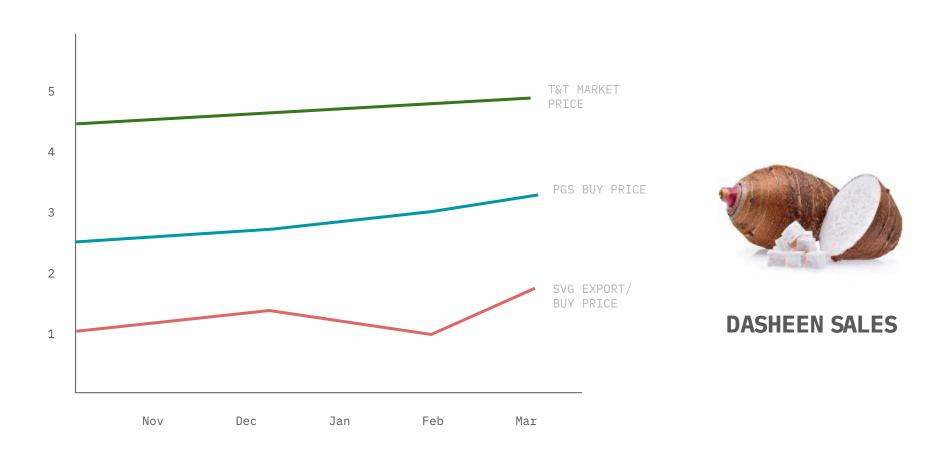












What's different?

- 2. Cash is still king, but convenience is princely

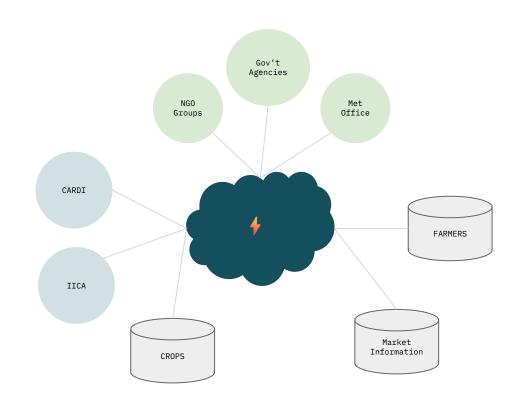
Challenges:

- 1. Caribbean agriculture has legacy issues: SPS, NTBs, other acronyms
