ISOLINA BOTO – HEAD OF NETWORKS AND ALLIANCES, COLEAD

Isolina Boto is the Head of Networks and Alliances at COLEAD, a non-profit Association of



private sector operators in the agrifood sector active in the EU, Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific (ACP) regions. Isolina has more than 25 years of experience in agricultural development. She started her career with the European Commission and has also worked with various ACP embassies and NGOs in areas related to food security, rural development and trade. Before joining COLEAD, she was the Manager of the Technical Centre for

Agricultural and Rural Cooperation ACP-EU (CTA) Brussels Office (2004-2020) implementing policy initiatives related to the ACP-EU cooperation in the field of agricultural and rural development. She has led agribusiness projects in support of capacity development of SMEs, entrepreneurs and farmers organisations across Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific.

BETHLEHEM DEJENE, CEO ZAFREE PAPERS

Bethelhem Dejene is the Founder & CEO of Zafree Papers, a clean-tech company transforming



agricultural waste into 100% tree-free paper products, reducing deforestation while creating value for over 8,000 smallholder farmers. An Economics graduate from Addis Ababa University, she has successfully expanded her venture from Ethiopia to Zambia with plans for wider African scale-up. Recognized as Founder of the Year at the Global Startup Awards Africa 2024 and a Tony Elumelu Foundation–UNDP Programme alumna, Bethelhem combines innovation, sustainability, and inclusive business

models to drive impact in agrifood value chains. Her leadership and vision position her at the







forefront of eco-innovation, earning her recognition in global platforms such as the Sustainable Packaging Summit 2025.

NATHANIEL EDJEBA, BUSINESS COACH SOILLESS FARM LAB

Nathaniel Edjeba is an agricultural professional with strong expertise in agribusiness, project



management, and farm operations. He holds a Bachelor of Agriculture in Agricultural Economics (University of Benin) and an Agribusiness Certification from Wageningen University and has led impactful initiatives empowering farmers and young entrepreneurs. As Project Supervisor with the British American Tobacco Nigeria Foundation, he supported over 400 rural farmers through climate-smart agriculture training that improved yields by 80%, while also establishing demonstration sites to promote

innovation. He has co-trained more than 4,000 youths annually in greenhouse farming with EYiA, facilitated the deployment of 320 greenhouses per year, and currently serves as a Business Coach at Soilless Farmlab, mentoring over 70 agribusinesses and supporting innovative financing models such as cluster fish farming. Nathaniel also played a key role in securing ISO 22000, HACCP, and Halal certifications, enhancing food safety standards and opening export opportunities, underscoring his dedication to driving innovation, sustainability, and excellence in African agriculture.

He assumed this leadership role in December 2024 after serving as Director of Meteorological Operations at Senegal's ANACIM. Holding a PhD and Master's from Columbia University in New York, Dr. Ndiaye is a seasoned expert in climate prediction and its practical application. He

has led the development of district-level working groups in Senegal to translate climate data into actionable services for farmers and fishers via rural radio, mobile messaging, and social media, and coordinated implementation of heat-wave early warning systems across West Africa acmad.org+1. He served as national focal point for the IPCC and contributed to its 6th Assessment Report (Working Group I), and is a board member of the Global Heat Health Information Network (GHHIN)
