Climate Reality in the Caribbean

Extreme Weather

Category-4+ hurricanes (e.g., Melissa), flooding, landslides

Heat stress damaging crops, livestock and factory

productivity

Drought causing crop losses, water scarcity, reduced

yields

Rising energy costs affecting women-led small enterprises

Gender Impact

Women impacted disproportionately

Higher unpaid care burden,

Limited land/asset ownership → limited climate finance access, Disrupted value chains affect women-dominated microbusinesses



Impacts on Women-led Businesses



Post-harvest Losses

Post-harvest losses rising above the "normal" 30–40% after extreme weather.

Women farmers have less access to irrigation, inputs, credit, and training



Supply Chain

Price volaltility disrupting women's micro-enterprises.
Supply-chain interruptions reducing export potential,
Increased food insecurity burdens rural women



ACSL is creating sustainable cold storage and logistical solutions for the Jamaican agricultural sector, reducing post-harvest losses, empowering local communities (particularly women) and building climate resiliency.

Climate-Resilient Agro-Processing

Diversification

Product diversification protects against crop-season volatility,

Uses local crops (pumpkin, mango, pepper, sorrel) → supports small farmers

Export diversification (UK, USA, Caribbean) building resilience

Sustainability

Solar integration and efficient equipment reduce emissions

Results

- Higher value-added per crop
- More stable farm-to-market pathways for rural women



Women Entrepreneurs Strategies that Works

Diversifying products

Developing value-added products and specialty foods; diversification reduce risk from commodity price volatility, extend market reach, and enhance income stability.

Using renewable energy

Climate-smart agriculture, Renewableenergy tech + cold chain, Digital tools

Digital transformation

Online sales, remote logistics planning and e-

Shared Assets

Cooperative purchasing & shared assets (shared cold storage, shared marketing

Flexible Models

Flexible business models (farm-to-factory, contract farming, small-batch production)



Gender Barriers that Limit Climate Action

>Land Ownership

Women own <20% of titled farmland in the region

>Cultural bias

Unpaid care restricts time for training

➤ Financing

- Limited collateral → limited loans for adaptation, Gender bias in financing ("bring your husband to sign")
- underrepresented in STEM and RE
- Climate finance flows rarely reach women-led enterprises....even in public sector

What Women Need to Scale Climate-Resilient Businesses

- 1. Gender-responsive climate finance e.g. concessional loans and grant top up
- 2. Capacity development e.g. woman farmers prioritized for training
- 3. Networks & mentorship
- 4. Policy alignment e.g. climate-smart equipment tax waivers
- 5. Meaningful PPP e.g. ACSL partnership model
- Government provides land at agro-parks

 Climate-smart processing tech transfer, Women-led RE solutions (solar pumps, cold storage)

≻ Value Chains

Joint export value chains, Digital trade platforms led by women

≻Capacity Building

 Peer-learning cohorts on gender-climate policy, Shared training in regenerative agriculture & green jobs

Call to Action

Gender & Climate Finance

Create a dedicated Gender & Climate
Finance Facility for the Global South with guarantees, grants, flexible
collateral rules, and targeted support
for women in agriculture, STEM, and
renewable energy. Led by: UN
Women + regional development
banks + private sector alliances
