# LAILA ACHIENG, CEO, <u>CNS NUTRI FOOD</u>, KENYA

Laila Achieng is a seasoned entrepreneur and business leader with more than 18 years of



experience in agribusiness, logistics, and international trade. She is the Chief Executive Officer of CNS Nutrifoods and Trio Link Logistics Limited, two Kenyan enterprises advancing innovation and sustainability across Africa's agrifood value chains. At CNS Nutrifoods, she drives the export of premium Kenyan products such as avocados, cashew nuts, mangoes, vegetables, and herbs, promoting climate-smart sourcing and market access for farmers. Through Trio Link Logistics, she champions digital, datadriven logistics solutions that improve transparency and competitiveness

from farm to market. A Harvard CORe and USIU–Africa MBA alumna, Laila previously held senior roles at Syokimau ICD, Mantrac Kenya, Nokia Siemens Networks, and SGS Kenya, and she continues to advocate for a foresight-driven, innovation-led agrifood future for Africa.

He cultivates maize, ginger, turmeric, cocoa, oil palm, plantain, cassava, and cocoyam, and is currently establishing a ginger processing centre to reduce post-harvest losses and enhance value addition for smallholder farmers across four key communities, Gyankoba, Hwediem, Atwima Foase, and Trabuom. With a BSc in General Agriculture from the University of Cape Coast and multiple certifications in green enterprise development,

conservation agriculture, and agribusiness innovation, Augustine is committed to empowering rural farmers through climate-smart production, agroforestry, and inclusive value chain development.

She is the Founder of Spring Agriventure, a farmer service centre based in Elgeyo Marakwet, Kenya, that supports smallholder farmers through certified potato seed multiplication, input supply, climate-smart training, and market linkages. With a Master's degree in Agri-Enterprise Development, Judith has extensive experience in sustainable agriculture, farmer capacity building, and inclusive agribusiness, having worked with

organisations such as the Cereal Growers Association and Africa Harvest Biotech Foundation. An alumna of the Young Farmer Exchange Program in Germany, she is passionate about empowering youth and women and advancing climate-resilient agriculture to improve rural livelihoods across Kenya.

and professional development.



# NOËL N'GUESSAN, CO-FOUNDER, LONO, CÔTE D'IVOIRE

Noël N'Guessan is a Bioprocess engineer with experience in energy and nutrient recovery



from organic waste. He founded with Louise Antonia Bijleveld LONO, an engineering SME based in Côte d'Ivoire, that makes carbon and nutrient recycling accessible to farmers. Since launching in 2017, the company has developed two products under the brand name Kubeko that smallholder farmers can use to directly recycle the nutrients and organic matter back into their soils. The company works directly with cooperatives and larger

value chain organisations to integrate their sustainability strategies such as the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO) for palm oil and ECOCERT for cacao and fruit production. The company is also developing larger industrial composting projects that create local bioeconomy for organic waste.

#### DR. BABAFEMI OYEWOLE, CEO, PAFO

Dr. Babafemi Oyewole, the CEO of Pan African Farmers Organization (PAFO), is a tri-sector



executive and professional with experiences in the public, private and non-government sectors, and a veteran in the management of international institutions. Prior to his appointment at PAFO, he was the CEO of the African Agribusiness Alliance; former CEO of African Cashew Alliance; former Executive Director/CEO of African Energy Investment Corporation (AEICORP); Deputy Secretary General of the West African Bankers Association (WABA); General Manager, Banque Internationale

du Benin, and Senior Economist with the Bank of Industry, Nigeria. He was a Regional Consultant on natural resources management policy in African countries with the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD). He is a member of Africa Regional Experts on Policy Dialogue on Natural Resource-based Development at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).
