Dr. Emem Aniekanabasi Alban - Chief Executive Officer, Emani Farms Giant Ltd, Nigeria

Dr. Emem Aniekanabasi Alban is a Nigerian agribusiness and humanitarian leader championing climate-



resilient food systems and women's economic empowerment. As CEO of Emani Farms Giant Ltd, she pioneers commercial hydroponics and aquaponics, producing high-value vegetables with 80% less water while creating dignified green jobs for women and youth. Through her foundation, the End Hunger Humanitarian Initiative, she leads community-based programs that have fed and trained over 2,500 families—linking smallholder farmers, women cooks, and schoolchildren in a sustainable nutrition ecosystem. A certified project manager, professional logistician, and agrifood social innovator, Dr. Alban integrates business innovation with humanitarian action—showing that women-led agribusiness can transform climate risk into resilience, prosperity, and community impact across Africa.

Alonso Bobes is an international professional specialized in International Relations and Humanitarian Aid,



with a strong commitment to global cooperation and sustainable development.
